**Inclusionary Zoning Program Minimum & Maximum Household Income
Limits for 2016**

These income limits are for D.C. Law 16-275; D.C. Official Code § 6-1041.02 et seq. and the Inclusionary Zoning Implementation regulations adopted by the Zoning Commission for the District of Columbia and codified in Title 11 Chapter 26 of the DCMR. Maximum Household Income Limits are based on the Washington Metropolitan Statistical Area 2015 Area Median Income (AMI) of \$108,600 for a household of four, as published by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on March 31, 2016. The limits are adjusted for household size.

Minimum Household Income

Unit Type	Units at 50% of AMI	Units at 80% of AMI
Studio	\$30,000	\$48,000
1	\$32,148	\$51,443
2	\$38,590	\$61,737

NOTE: Minimum incomes are only applicable to rental Inclusionary Units. If a household has rental assistance (such as a Housing Choice Voucher) they may still qualify for the rental Inclusionary Unit.
