**FY 2026 Recovery Housing Program (RHP) Substantial Amendment
To the Recovery Housing Program Action Plan**

The District of Columbia (the District) is projected to receive an allocation of ~\$1,637,131.00 in Recovery Housing Program (RHP)¹ FY 2026 grant funds.

RHP allows the District to provide funding for stable, transitional housing for individuals in recovery from a substance use disorder. Funding is for a maximum of two years per individual or until the individual secures permanent housing.

The District proposes the following:

The District is required to provide a 15-day comment period for the FY26 RHP Amendment. The comment period will begin on July 31, 2025, and end at 5:00 pm on August 14p, 2025.

The District will submit the proposed amendment and all public comments to HUD by August 16, 2025, through the Disaster Recovery Grant Reporting System (DRGR).
