# HOW TO REGISTER FOR THE REQUIRED INCLUSIONARY ZONING (IZ) ORIENTATION CLASS

Interested households need to contact the Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) on the next page to register for the Inclusionary Zoning (IZ) Orientation Class.

#### How to Find a Class

A list of CBOs and when they generally hold daytime and/or evening classes begins on the next page. Please note that this information is for general guidance only and you should contact the CBOs to confirm dates, times, and locations. You also may contact the CBOs to determine if a location offers space for stand-bys/walk-ins. Please be on time as students who are more than 15 minutes late may not be admitted and may need to reschedule.

#### **Length of Class**

The course is a one-time session that typically lasts two hours.

#### **About the Class Completion Certificate**

The certificate that you earn is valid for two years.

#### **Next Steps After Completing the Class**

- After taking the course for the first time, you must register for the IZ program here: https://dhcd.dc.gov/service/inclusionary-zoning-affordable-housing-program.
- To continue your initial registration beyond the initial two years, you will need to re-take the orientation before your two-year certificate expires and call 2O2-442-7221 or email iz.adu@dc.gov with your new code and household information updates.

Note: In order to be eligible to purchase an IZ unit, you also must attend housing counseling for homebuyers. This class is above and beyond the mandatory, introductory IZ Orientation, as it reviews topics specific to purchasing a home such as home contracts, home inspections, and mortgages. This counseling can be a class (typically four to eight hours long) or one-on-one counseling. For details contact the following organizations—Latino Economic Development Center, Housing Counseling Services, Lydia's House or University Legal Services (all three locations). Their contact information is on the back of this page. Be sure to obtain a certificate of completion from whichever organization you attend.
